MINUTES

Call to Order

A Work Session, open to the public, of the Board of Education for Rochester Community Schools, Rochester, Michigan was held on Monday, September 24, 2018 Brewster Elementary School. President Sandy Fiaschetti called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. Board members led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

A. Secretary of the Board of Education

C. Members of the Board of Education

Kevin Beers received a correspondence from Jerry Murphy regarding the tennis courts at RHS.

Andrea Walker-Leidy received a correspondence from the Parent Advisory Committee on a Dyslexia talk on Tuesday, October 2nd.

Principal Kelly Dessy welcomed the Board of Education to Brewster Elementary School and gave the Board an update on new staff and student initiatives taking place at Brewster. Four student members of Brewster's Community Service Kids project updated the Board their ongoing community service efforts.

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Work Session

A. AdvancED Visit Overview

Karen Gelardi presented an overview of the District Accreditation process taking place September 30th through October 3rd. AdvancED will have a six member team visiting RCS looking for coherent themes running through all areas of our system. Dr. Shaner provided the background on the work that Karen has done to date, reporting that in the past each of our high schools went through the accreditation process separately. RCS Principals Kelly Dessy, Marnie Barker, Cathryn Skedel and Wendy Darga discussed how administrators developed plans at Instructional Leadership Team (ILT) meetings to look at systemness and show a coherent theme working with colleagues throughout all grade levels to prepare for the visit. Administrators looked at the Strategic Improvement Plan and the District Improvement Plan for guidance in developing their goals.

AdvancED team members will conduct interviews, spend time at selected schools observing classrooms and conduct focus groups with staff, students and building leadership teams. After the review the team will provide us with feedback, their report will be reviewed at the national level of AdvancED to determine if the 5 year accreditation will be awarded.

Board discussion included:

- Why we haven't applied for system accreditation before
- Will we have to apply for accreditation again in 5 years
- · What other local districts are accredited
- Information that administrators will present to the accreditation team
- Supporting data that will be shared with the accreditation team to show school improvement

Karen Gelardi, Kelly Dessy, Marnie Barker, Wendy Darga and Cathryn Skedel responded to the Board.

B. Data Review

1. iReady Date and IRIP Process

Assistant Superintendent for Elementary Education, Equity & Inclusion Pamela Jones, reviewed Rochester's iReady Benchmark & Diagnostic Assessments. Testing includes all students K-5 with three testing windows per year. Reports include individualized student data which reflects "on grade level" results as well as curriculum and instructional data. iReady data is used to identify students who need individual help in meeting the requirements of the Read by Grade Three Law and assists with developing reading intervention services. iReady and M-STEP data allows for national comparisons on student growth. This data allows administrators and teachers to target students and curriculum data to meet building and district school improvement goals. M-Step and i-Ready data analysis shows RCS students achieving at a much higher level than county and state averages.

2. M-STEP

Assistant Superintendent for Secondary Education, Equity & Inclusion Carrie Lawler reviewed M-STEP data analysis for middle and high school mathematics and science programs. Mathematics scores have remained constant and we have implemented a comprehensive plan to improve science achievement with new science kits for K-5, a new science program for 6-8 along with a

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new part time science consultant focusing on 6-8. Social studies standards are currently undergoing a review process.

3. PSAT/SAT

Carrie Lawler reviewed 9th, 10th and 11th grade SAT/PSAT scores and discussed building and district improvement goals based on high school PSAT results. District goals remain focused on school-wide efforts to prepare students for the tests. Data rooms show individual student test results to assist with identifying students who preform below expectation. Beginning this year 8th grade students will take the PSAT test instead of the M-STEP.

Board discussion included:

- Clarification of iReady test results
- Individual student scores/growth
- Do the iReady and M-STEP results match
- Why are science and social studies scores lower across the board
- Clarification of test results per grade level
- What are we doing for students who are at the top of the grade level to challenge their growth

Pamela Jones, Carrie Lawler, Marnie Barker, Kelly Dessy, Wendy Darga and Cathryn Skedel responded to the Board and discussed working with select groups of identified students who may need extra support to achieve grade level results or who are ready for additional challenges in literacy.

C. Panel Discussion with Principals

Principals who will be involved in district accreditation addressed the Board presenting the "Elevator pitch' speech they will present to the accreditation team.

Additional Business

A. Citizens Present at the Meeting

John VanOphem addressed the Board regarding traffic at Adams, cybersecurity at RCS and the related ongoing criminal investigation.

Dr. Shaner thanked Kelly Dessy for her hospitality and thanked Kelly, Karen Gelardi, Marnie Barker, Wendy Darga and Cathryn Skedel for participating in tonight's discussion.
