In case you missed it, a <u>short video</u> was presented at the May 3 Board of Education meeting that highlights our students' thoughtful and caring wishes for their teachers. The following are some updates for the week.

2021-22 School Calendar. Although the calendar is still being finalized, we are providing our community with key dates to help with planning purposes.

- First day of school for students: Aug. 30, 2021
- Winter break: Dec. 18, 2021 Jan. 2, 2022. Students return to school on Jan. 3, 2022.
- Spring break: March 26 April 3, 2022. Students return to school on April 4, 2022

Schedule clarification for 2020-21 school year. The last day of school for students is scheduled for Wednesday, June 9, 2021.

- June 7: Half day for students (6-12 and post high); hours 1-2. Full day for students (TK-5).
- June 8: Half day for students (6-12 and post high); hours 3-4. Full day for students (TK-5).
- June 9: Half day for students (6-12 and post high); hours 5-6. Half day for students (TK-5).

Health and wellness resources. Although our country has made great strides over the past year to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, the impact of the pandemic continues to devastate many countries around the world. Currently, there is a COVID-19 surge in India and Brazil. Our hearts go out to those who have lost a loved one due to the coronavirus and to all those who have been impacted. Weekly RCS COVID-19 reporting. The following COVID-19 information is from May 6, 2021, at 12 p.m. As a reminder, this chart is reflective of a single point in time and may change at a moment's notice due to the current public health environment. The total percentage of quarantine and isolated students across all grade levels is 1.99%. When comparing numbers to last week's report, student trends indicate a decrease in all areas.
