B. Approval of Bond Construction Project Bid Awards (Action Item) Dana Taylor

Assistant Superintendent for Business Dana Taylor presented the following construction project bid recommendations:

Playground Relocation for Hugger Elementary and Musson Elementary to be awarded to Rolar Property Services, in the amount of \$104,450.00, plus other project costs in the amount of \$17,352.00, for a total current project costs in the amount of \$121,802.00.

A change order to the original Secure Entry Technology Project that was approved on May 7, 2016, in the amount of \$5,749.00 to cover the Administration Building equipment and connectivity, and \$1,824.00 to cover Administration Building cabling.

Michelle Bueltel, parent, addressed the Board regarding the Musson playground relocation, and content filtering.

John Foster, from Convergent Technology Partners, addressed the Board clarifying the questions regarding content filtering.

C. Repair and Resurfacing of Stoney Creek High School Tennis Courts (Action Item) Dana Taylor

Dana Taylor presented a recommendation for award of bid to repair and resurface the Stoney Creek High School tennis courts to Goddard Coatings, in the amount of \$47,900.00, plus a contingency in the amount of \$4,790.00, for a total projects cost of \$52,690.00. (Source of Funding: General Fund)

A motion was made to award the contract to Goddard Coatings to repair and resurface the Stoney Creek High School tennis courts.

D. Replacement of Student Information System (Action Item) Dana Taylor

Dana Taylor presented a recommendation for award of a Request for Proposal for Replacement of the Student Information System be given to Edupoint in the amount \$648,057.00 for fiscal years 2016-2021, plus a contingency each year of Year 1 and Year 2 not to exceed \$22,000.00 per year, for a total cost in the amount not to exceed \$692,057.00. (Source of Funding: General Fund)

Information Systems Supervisor Donny Milovski and Computer Management Technologies, Inc. Manager Barb Kostick addressed the Board to outline the features of the new SIS software.

A motion was made to award the contract for the new Student Information System to Edupoint for an amount not to exceed \$692,057.00.
